Policies and Procedures

1. 02-06 Policy For Admittance of Non-Practicing Registered Reflexology Therapist to Practicing Registered Reflexology Therapist Membership Category

0-1 year: automatic reinstatement upon meeting membership requirements

1-5 years: pending Board approval applicant will need to satisfy theoretical and clinical requirements as detailed in the Continuing Education Unit document

after 5 years: re-certification required

When a candidate does not meet NSARP's minimal educational requirements or is in need of retraining, he/she will be referred to a qualified instructor for mandatory continuing education.

2. 09-06 Policy Regarding Mechanical Appliances

NSARP does not endorse the use of mechanical devices which claim to provide professional Reflexology treatment. Modern technology cannot replace the use of the human hand in the application of therapy.

3. 06-07 Policy Regarding Terminology For Registered Reflexology Therapists

Practicing Registered Reflexology Therapists (RRTs) belonging to NSARP will be referred to as reflexology practitioners or reflexology therapists.

4. 01-08 Policy Regarding Therapeutic Reflexology

NSARP considers that the treatment of a specified health disorder is an integral component of a therapeutic reflexology session. Symptoms are considered and addressed during the course of treatment in an effort to induce a positive change in the client's underlying condition.

5. 03-08 Policy Regarding Correspondence Reflexology Certification Programs

For NSARP to consider graduates of correspondence Reflexology certification programs as fully qualified and prepared to enter into professional practice, their program of study will need to have a clinical component that includes experience in a supervised (classroom) setting as well as a theoretical component.



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Graduates of these institutes applying for membership as a professional practitioner with NSARP will be referred to a qualified instructor for consideration of their school's curriculum. The reviewing instructor will determine the extent to which, if any, further educational requirements are necessary to meet the certification standards of his/her training program. Upon completion of these credits, the applicant will be considered qualified to meet the requirements for NSARP's professionally practicing category of membership.

6. 12-15 Policy Regarding Remuneration for Board of Directors

- a) The Board of Director members are entitled to receive a fifty percent (50%) discount off membership dues.
- b) The Board of Directors are entitled to receive mileage at a rate to be determined by the Board of Directors when attending official board duties (i.e., Board meetings).
